The core premise of the program is based on the 7 Root Safety Strategies, which are reinforced and practiced throughout each grade level.

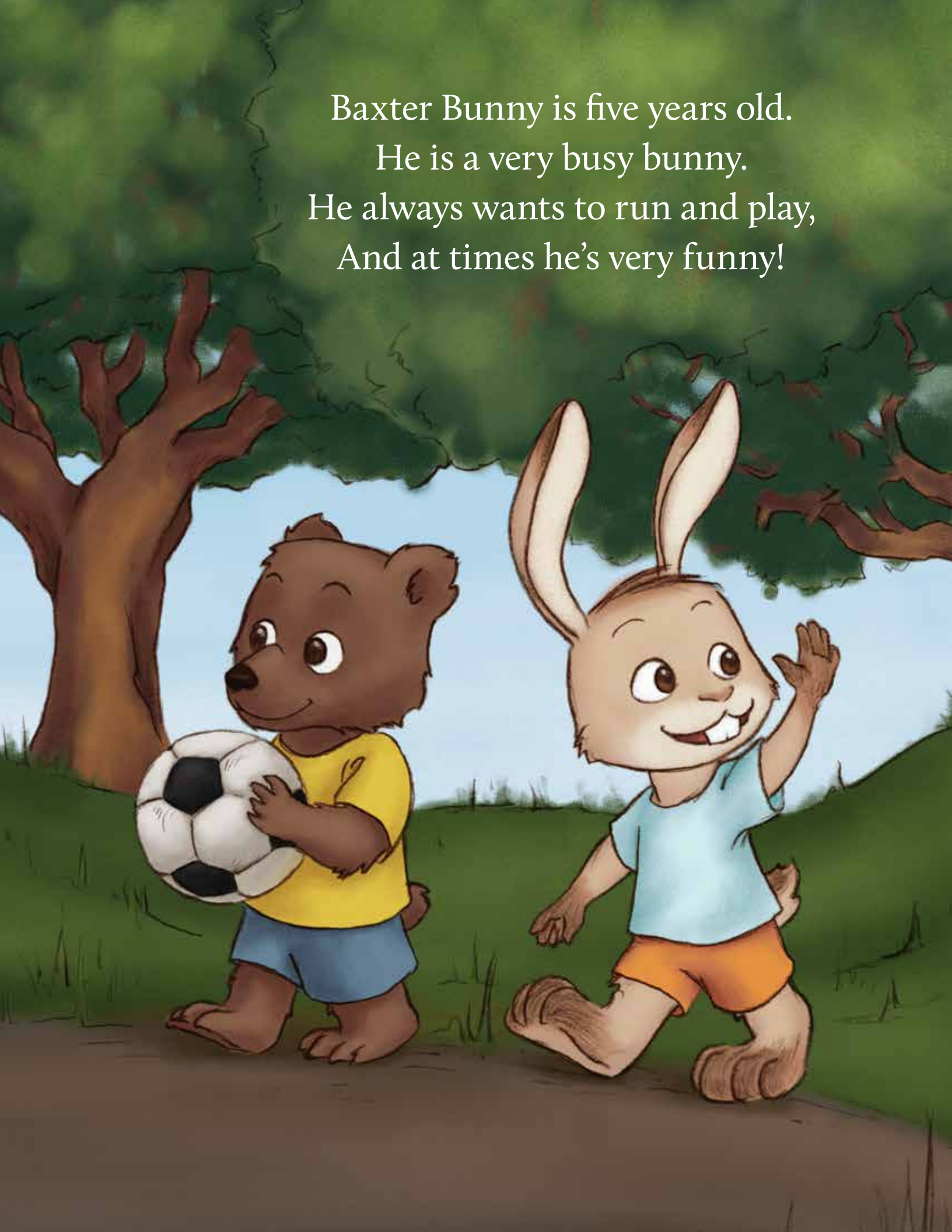

He brings a buddy along!





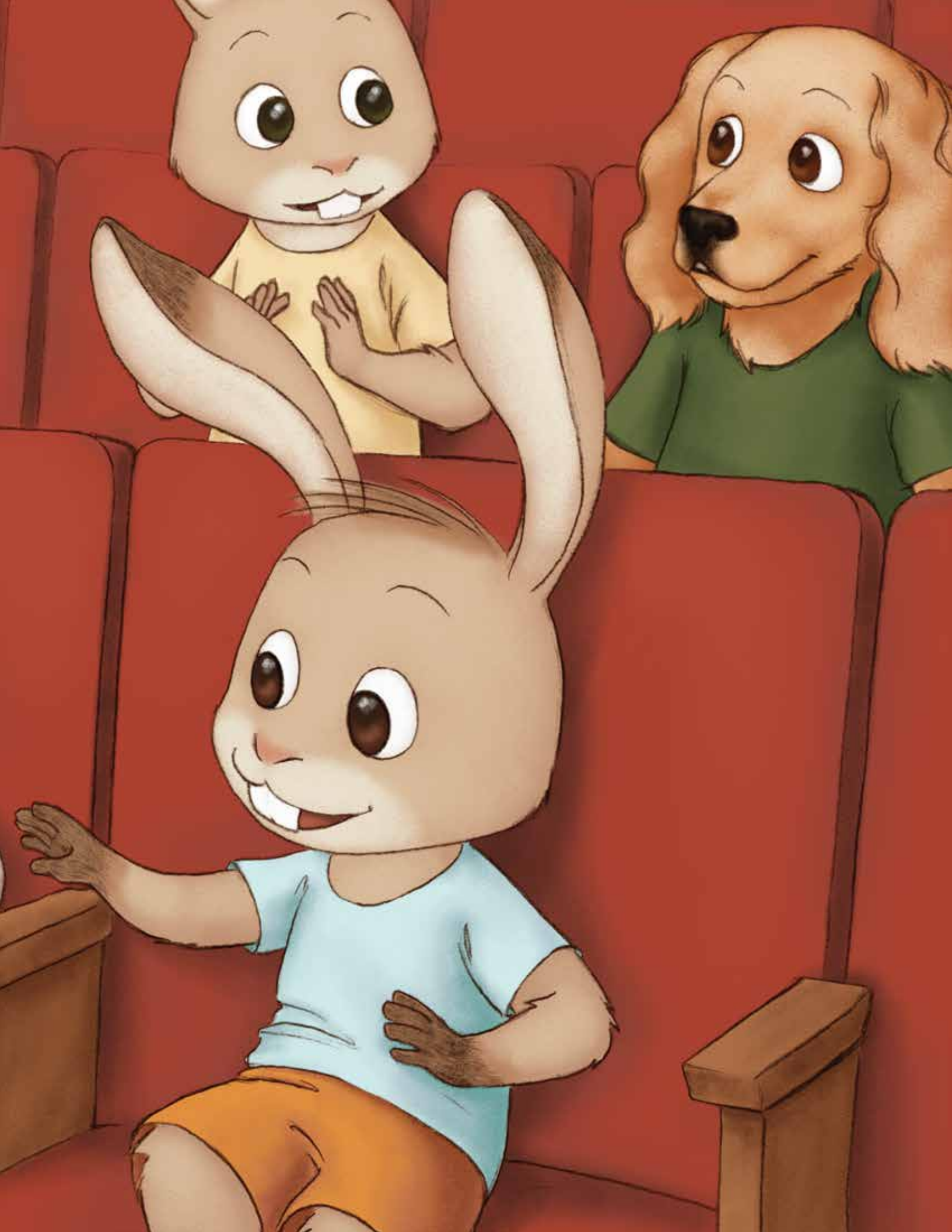
When he walks to and from school,

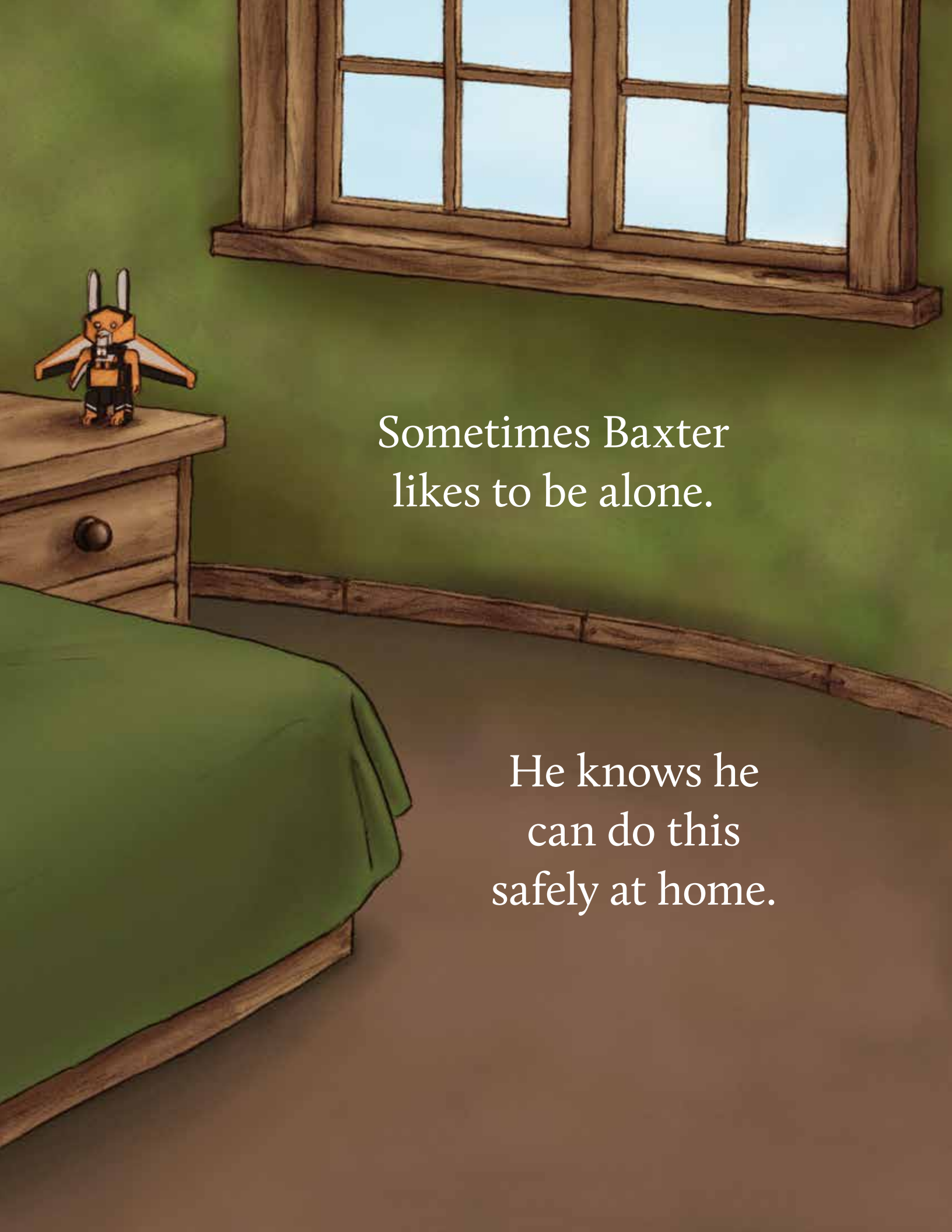




When Baxter goes to the park to play,
